CALL TO ARTISTS

The Art-in-Architecture Program of the Capital Development Board is pleased to announce a Request for Qualifications (RFQ) to Illinois professional artists to create permanent original public art for the Illinois Central College Library and Administration Building in East Peoria, Illinois.

Note: Applying before the final deadline is highly encouraged. Any portfolio submitted after the deadline will not be considered for this project.

ELIGIBILITY

These public art commissions and potential purchases are open to all professional artists, artisans, or artist-led teams *that live and work in the state of Illinois*.

- An artist/artisan is defined as a skilled practitioner that generates designs and concepts for creative works that reflect form, beauty, and aesthetic perception. All artists on a team must be from Illinois.
- Subcontractors may be used and are defined as those providing technical implementation such as construction, fabrication, and/or assembly for portions or all of a finished product under direct supervision and control of an artist.
- Faculty and staff of Illinois Central College are not eligible to apply for this commission.

CONSTRUCTION PROJECT

<u>Illinois Central College</u> is a community college with its main campus in East Peoria, Illinois. Established in 1967, the campus comprises 30 buildings. The Library/Administration Building is a 6-story building constructed in 1974.

The main purpose of this renovation and addition project at the Library/ Administration Building is to create an inviting front entrance to welcome students and visitors to the campus. Reorganizing department functions also allows for better visibility and access to needed services.

Areas addressed include admissions, registration, financial aid, student accounts, testing, access services, and other similar student services functions. Overall circulation and wayfinding into and throughout the Student Services Center are included as part of this project to create an easily navigable facility for students. The landscaping and site work will guide visitors to the new entry addition.

ARTWORK SITE AND OBJECTIVES

The Committee is seeking a 7'x7' wall installation located in the entrance lobby above the self-serve student kiosk stations. The artwork will welcome students and visitors, and provide further interest in the building reception area. The installation should celebrate ICC and its students, and be cognizant of the building aesthetic.

Artists are not limited to a specific medium. The artwork wall is brick with concrete backup, and provisions must be made regarding the weight of the installation and how it is fastened to the wall without causing damage. The artwork must be durable and safe with limited annual maintenance. Lastly, downlighting or a wall wash light may be installed at the ceiling above to highlight the art, and electrical provisions will be provided.

SELECTION PROCESS

The Fine Arts Review Committee will review the portfolios of eligible applicants. At least three artists/teams will be selected as semi-finalists and paid a fee of \$500 each to develop and present a site-specific design proposal. After the presentations, the Committee will select a winning artist/teams for the commission. Correspondence will be sent to the semi-finalists and to the winning artist/team detailing the proposal process and contracts.

BUDGET DETAILS

The budget for the artwork is **\$23,000.** This budget covers all expenses associated with the completion and installation of the work including, but not limited to the project design, materials, fabrication, tools, project management, operations, meetings, travel, installation, licenses, insurance, contracted services, delivery of the work to the site, and documentation of the completed project. Any expense that exceeds the contracted amount will be the artist's responsibility.

The artist is responsible for working with the Capital Development Board Art-in-Architecture Program, the Client Agency, and other relevant partners to oversee all aspects of the art installation.

- Press clippings, volunteer work, artwork/commission spotlight, or other relevant information

Please note:

- Attach all files to the email
- JPEG files are required for artwork images
- PDF or Word files are required for all documents
- Name each document "lastnamefirstname_document", for example: KahloFrida_coverletter.pdf KahloFrida_imagelist.doc
- DO NOT include artwork images within the body of the email
- DO NOT send design proposals
- All submittals become property of the Capital Development Board Art-in-Architecture Program. Submissions can be made available for public viewing. The artist retains copyright.

LEGAL AGREEMENT

The Capital Development Board Art-in-Architecture Program reserves the right to alter any aspect of the selection process or overall project in any way for its own convenience at any time. This Request for Qualifications does not constitute either an expressed or implied contract and these provisions are subject to change.

ABOUT THE ART-IN-ARCHITECTURE PROGRAM

The Illinois Art-in-Architecture Program promotes and preserves Illinois art and enriches communities by commissioning original artwork for public buildings constructed with State funds.

The enabling legislation for the Program requires that the Capital Development Board "shall set aside 1/2 of 1 percent of the amount authorized and appropriated for construction or reconstruction of each public building financed in whole or in part by State funds and generally accessible to and used by the public for purchase and placement of suitable works of art in such public buildings." A committee including art professionals and the project architect oversees each project and selects the artwork.






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








ICC Library and Administration Building East Peoria, Illinois 810-036-026
